

Contradictions Continued

<p>A I am wearing a shirt.</p>	<p>B I am not wearing a shirt.</p>
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Good ways to describe A & B.	(Grammatically or Otherwise) Bad ways to describe A & B.
A contradicts B. A is a contradiction of B.	A & B is contradiction.
A & B contradict (one another/each other).	A & B are contradiction. A & B are contradictions.
A & B are contradictory (statements).	A contradict B. A is contradict B. A & B are contradict each other/one another.
A & B together express a contradiction.	A is true means B is not true.
If A is true, B cannot also be true.	Both A & B can't be true.
A being true would rule out the possibility of B.	In my opinion, A doesn't contradict B.
A & B can't both be true at the same time.	A is contradiction to B
A & B are mutually exclusive conditions.	A & B could both be true at the same time if I am a different person in each sentence.
Only one of A or B can be true.	If you think what I'm wearing is a shirt, but I think it's a vest (not a shirt), A & B can both be true at once.
Both A & B can't be true at once.	A doesn't rule out the possibility of B because I will eventually take off my shirt.
If we accept that A is true, that would rule out B also being true.	A & B describe different aspects of me and my relationship to a shirt. Therefore both may be true in different situations.
Given A, B is impossible.	If you close your eyes, you don't know if A or B is true, so they both could be true.
If both A & B were true, it would be contradictory/illogical/paradoxical.	There is only one of me, but the world contains many shirts. The individual angle and the big picture of the world show different aspects of the topic of shirt-wearing and can coexist without contradiction.
A & B are not compatible.	A is compatible with B because they are clearly related.
Sometimes A is true, and sometimes B is true, but they're never both true (at once).	Although A & B are totally different, they don't contradict on another. [sic]

Contradictions Continued

Neither A nor B must be true (A & B do not exhaust all possible conditions...I may be either putting on or taking off a shirt, during which time neither A nor B would be true.)

A is not contradict with B. A & B aren't contradicted. A & B don't contradict on another.

A & B are reasonable from different perspectives. It is reasonable that I sometimes am wearing a shirt, just as it is reasonable that I sometimes am not wearing a shirt.

(and vice versa, the positions A & B may be reversed and still be OK.)
