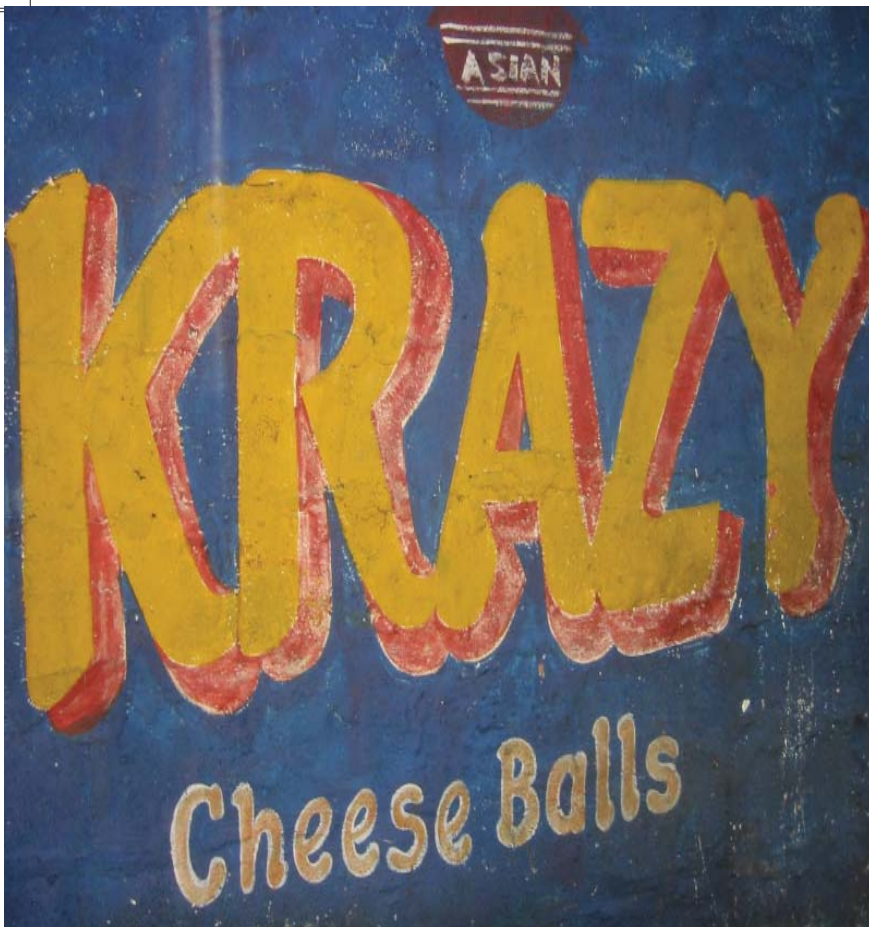

A Pan-Asia Madness Mix by DJ Poseur



Krazy Asian Cheese Balls isn't just a mix—it's a state of mind. These classic tracks span the world's largest continent and truly lean toward the slightly off-kilter and into the full-blown wacky. Most are from either China or Japan, as the traditional and current pillars of East Asia. Other countries as India, Korea make cameos supported by some whose state origins refuse to be pinpointed (partially due to lack of research/language skills) but seem to be SE Asian and with elements of Oceania. Some have already made appearances on DJ Poseur's Novelty compilations, but most are freshly aged for mass consumption. As you listen, please consider whether the cheesier nature of Asian music, as all of these pretend marginally to be pop songs, is due to an aesthetic of cheese, a technology gap, or an intentional preference for happy simple songs supported by a likely lack of formal musical training.

Some interpretive help with individual tracks and bands:

3' s band name is not accurate, but the cd lists no performing artist. The front liner actually reads “fong”, and all the tracks are casio versions of revolutionary songs. This one sings proudly of being a common soldier out to crush the Japanese devils. Were it not so cheery, it probably wouldn' t get along with the other songs, thematically.

4' s title in English is “A Cricket”. 8' s liner notes with the song names are written in traditional characters I can' t seem to find in my dictionary, but I always remembered this song by its chorus “我好可怜”, which means “I' m in pretty bad shape” or “I' m really miserable”. 10' s English title is “Foul-smelling Man”. 11' s English title is “Monkey”. 14' s English title is “We Passed the Director”. 16' s Korean letters only work for the band name, apparently. 17' s title, translated roughly, might be “Curious Business of the Gods”, but that' s a dictionary stab in the dark.
