*News: Vladimir Putin has accepted Beijing's invitation to attend the Winter Olympic Games in 2022. Britain, the US, and Australia announced a trilateral security partnership. Australia will deploy nuclear submarines from the USA (an example of nuclear proliferation, though the subs are nuclear *powered*, not nuclear armed).

Mexico's 200th anniversary of independence from Spain was celebrated and noted w/ a call from Xi.

China formally applied to join the countries other than the USA (which has abandoned the idea it started) in the TPP (CPTPP).

Gen. Mark Milley, U.S.

Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff (highest-ranking military officer in the U.S. gov't) published a book claiming that he reassured China twice that Pres. Trump would not launch a strike against it to stay in office after losing to Biden in 2020. GOP lawmakers are calling for his resignation.

*News: Pres. Biden seeks a phone call w/ Pres. Macron of France, which is still upset about the new nuclear

submarine deal with Australia. There are talks among European leaders about forming a European armed forces to reduce dependence on the U.S. military.

Pres. Biden raised the cap on U.S. intake of refugees to 125k, an doubling of the # under Pres. Trump, necessary after the withdrawal from Afghanistan. Many Trump supporters oppose immigration, even of refugees. Prime Minister Trudeau won the new election but failed to win a majority, similar to the 2019 vote in Canada.

The most important is the college

What factors matter in the USA?

The entrance examination is not the most important (some colleges don't require it). Recommendation letters, extracurricular activities (such as volunteering), high school grades, ethnicity, admissions essay.

Affirmative action policies try to address inequality in society and past hardship & discrimination.

Chinese and Russian ships passing
through a regional strait
The Winter Olympic Games torch was
passed to China
Former Sec. Of State Colin Powell
died of complications from Covid-19.
He is most famous for advocating for
the U.S. invasion of Iraq in 2003 to
prevent the development & use of
“weapons of mass destruction” which
were never found. He was fully

vaccinated, but at age 84 w/ multiple myeloma (a blood cancer) was very vulnerable. Some worry this will lead more Americans to question the vaccines.

White House says the U.S. is ready to engage with North Korea despite its most recent missile test.

*News: A meeting between 10 countries, incl. China & Russia, met to discuss aid to Afghanistan.

A Russian nuclear power plant has been leaking steam, causing it to be closed for maintenance.

*Review

*Warm-up Exercise: Security, IPE, or both?

Does the topic fit mostly in the subfield of Security, IPE, or both?

Why?

Examples: “First-strike” prohibition of nuclear weapons = security (As an int'lly regulated weapon, most countries have committed to not using nukes except for defensive/deterrence

purposes)

Proliferation of nuclear weapons = both (the spread of nukes often involves the int'l sale of technology between countries)

France lost its deal to produce nuclear submarines for Australia = IPE (France's security is not greatly affected; the issue is mainly an economic loss in trade for France.)

1. In the 2019 documentary “American Factory,” a Chinese billionaire opens a glass manufacturing factory in an abandoned GM plant in Ohio. (IPE, an example of a developing country giving foreign direct investment, FDI, in a developed country).

2. Immigration & global migration

(Both, migrations of people greatly affect the economies of “sending & receiving” nations & border control is central to security)

3. Will the new Taliban regime gain int'l recognition & a seat at the UN?

(Security, relates to sovereignty)

4. Russia is providing military aid to the Tatmadaw (the military junta in Myanmar/Burma) despite it killing over 1000 of its own citizens, among other human rights violations

(Security, about int'l intervention in a possible civil war)

5. The ongoing interdependence between China & the USA (both? I'd say this is mainly IPE, but also increasingly “securitized”...but this mainly about trade & finance)

6. The GATT (General Agreement on

Tariffs & Trade) was succeeded by the WTO. (IPE, very explicitly about global trade & tariffs)

7. A cease-fire in Nagorno-Karabakh has paused the territorial conflict between Armenia & Azerbaijan.

(Security, this is a rare example of a 21st century interstate war, or at least a skirmish)

8. Former Pres. Trump campaigned against the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) begun by Pres. Obama on the grounds that it would help China, and even under Biden the USA hasn't joined the organization it created.

(IPE, it's a free trade agreement)

9. In the 2016 documentary “Abacus: Small Enough to Jail,” a small bank in NYC's Chinatown, owned by a Chinese-American family, is shown as

the only U.S. bank to face criminal charges after the global financial crisis. (IPE, banking is related to finance, financial crises are global under globalization)

10. Pres. Biden's domestic infrastructure bill is seen as central to his agenda to “compete” with China, and he has yet to remove the tariffs on Chinese goods for which he strongly criticized Pres. Trump. (both?, another example of securitized IPE)

*News: On Oct. 17th, Russia & China took part in joint naval exercises, showing their increasing trust & cooperation against Japanese “provocations”
Japanese princess broke away from

royalty w/ a marriage to a man who works in the USA.

The USA has suspended hundreds of millions of dollars in aid to Sudan after a military coup detained the civilian leader. Protesters have been fired upon but continue to demand a return to the “power sharing” arrangement & elections to be held in 2023, following the ouster of former leader Al-Bashir in 2019.

*Review

*With a partner, discuss: Q: In your opinion, why have there been no “great power wars” since WWII? (Great powers have been involved in “proxy wars” as the “hot” parts of the Cold War, between the Soviet Union & USA, but not fought each other directly on the battlefield.) Give specific reasons

related to your major, and also consider addressing reasons you think are *not* important or less important than your main reasons. Your answers follow...
“The theme of the times” is peace & development, rather than war & conflict. But why? And how do we know?
I've never heard a non-Chinese person say this before.

Nuclear weapons & WMDs (Weapons of Mass Destruction) → MAD (Mutually Assured Destruction)

Full-scale war is seen to weaken countries and allow others to rise.

Superpower status as a global hegemon has prevented great powers from going to war. (HST Hegemonic Stability Theory → Pax Americana)

Economic interdependence means that great power wars would be “bad for business” (global capitalism → peace).

The great powers care primarily about

their economic strength, competing in technology & trade instead of militarily. Int'l cooperation through global institutions such as the UN (& int'l law). We trust each other more. Post-war pacifism says war is illegal & unjust. We have no more “greedy states” seeking to expand their territory at the expense of rivals.

*Power poll results on Japan Vs. Russia: Unanimously in favor of Russia...why?
Compare to U.S. classroom: U.S. students believe Japan is more powerful than Russia.

Is Russia today still “Upper Volta with rockets”?

How do we define & measure power in IR?

GDP = Gross Domestic Product (size of the economy)

Soft Power = attractiveness. Other countries want to emulate (be like) Japan, not Russia.

We traditionally focus on states because they are the most powerful actors.

We divide actors into states & non-state actors.

*News: The U.S. announced a diplomatic boycott of the Beijing Winter Olympics, and Beijing announced its strong opposition to it,

claiming a violation of the non-politicization principle of the Olympics.

New chairman announced for a major Russian political party.

Russia continues to amass troops on the Ukrainian border, leading Pres.

Biden to warn against an invasion, while Putin demands that the U.S.

Guarantee that NATO will not expand eastward.

The RMB is now more “in demand” all around the world.

Exchange rates are either floating (based on supply & demand in the global currency market) or pegged (usually to the USD, for the purpose of stability). The Chinese yuan is “in the middle” between these, said to be a “floating peg”.

PPP = Purchasing power parity

At PPP, China has a larger GDP than the USA.

*Government budgets: income/ revenue (allowance) & expenses (i.e. as a student, these include room & board, tuition).

Budgets may be balanced or unbalanced (deficit or surplus). If you have deficits again and again, this

builds up to an accumulated debt.

This is called a country's "national debt". Debt Vs. Debit Vs. Debate
National debt can be measured in face value/principle, but also in the ratio of debt to GDP.

Fiscally responsible governments try to balance the budget or maintain a surplus.

To balance the budget, what can a government do?

(Fiscal policy & monetary policy, parts of macroeconomics) Most simply, the government can increase revenues (taxes) or decrease spending. Why not spend the money for the Belt and Road Initiative at home?

The USA and China, the two largest economies in the world, are said to be "interdependent." A goal of the

Trump Admin. & especially his “trade war” was to “decouple” the two economies.

China buys U.S. debt in the form of gov’t bonds. The USA buys Chinese goods.

Why lend money to a developed country like the USA? If China spent the money domestically, the economy would “overheat,” and inflation would be very high.

But isn’t China a poor, developing country? Where does all the money come from? Chinese citizens have some of the highest personal savings rates in the world. Americans don't save money; they spend & consume!

*News: The USA, Australia, & Canada have announced a “diplomatic boycott” of the 2022 Winter Olympics. China has decried the decision as politicizing the games. China expressed appreciation to the IOC & countries which did send

diplomatic groups to the games.

Xi Jinping extended condolences over the tornadoes which killed 70+ & did widespread damage in the mid-South of the USA, especially in KY.

The Pentagon says no military personnel involved in the errant drone strike in Afghanistan which killed 10 civilians will be punished.

sentenced a Russian citizen to life in prison in Germany for killing a German citizen. Two Russian diplomats were expelled in response. A secret party flouting British Covid-19 regulations has PM Johnson in a “crisis of confidence” among the public. Omicron is, by Johnson's admission, spreading very quickly there. The British gov't released its semi-annual report on Sino-British relations, and China criticized it as being in no position to lecture others on human rights.

The U.S. Senate confirmed Nicholas Burns (former Harvard professor & NATO official) as the new ambassador to China. Why has it taken so long for the USA to appoint/

confirm him? Sen. Marco Rubio (R of Florida), a China hawk, had been blocking the nomination.
